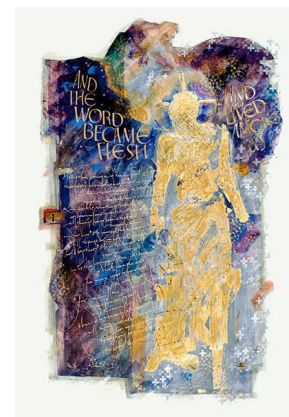

Centering Prayer is increasingly recognized and practiced across Church denominations as an effective means to learn to still our own inner voices so that we may better hear God's voice and know the Spirit's movement in and around us.
